The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded Mississippi Home Corporation an additional \$173,134.00 in Fiscal Year 2017 funds. MHC amended the 2017 Annual Action Plan to include the Supplemental Emergency Solutions Grant Program award. Mississippi was required to use to address the goal established by HUD for use of funds “to assist communities which lost significant capacity to serve the homeless after January 2016.” These supplemental funds were only available for use inside the Central Mississippi Continuum of Care (CoC) and to Non-profit organizations within the City of Jackson who will be eligible to submit applications in the homelessness prevention, street outreach, HMIS (Homeless Management Information System), and/or rapid rehousing categories only. The counties to be served are Copiah, Hinds, Madison, Rankin, Simpson, and Warren.
